



# Report on the Faculty Development Initiative March 2015

### Webinars

Since November 2014, AACN has offered 31 webinars with a total of 3,442 individual registrations and average attendance rate of 52%. Total webinar attendees were from 639 various schools, organizations, associations, and healthcare systems. Of the total number of attendees, faculty from 504 AACN member schools, representing 68% of the membership, attended at least one live webinar event during this period.

In addition to two Town Hall webinars with AACN's new CEO and two feedback sessions with the Futures Task Force, the following webinars have been offered since November 2014. These events are listed in reverse chronological order, and the registration number is listed in parentheses after each Webinar title. Please note that continuing nursing education credits from the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) were provided for all webinars unless otherwise noted by an asterisk. ### Conferences

The **Faculty Development Conference** (FDC) was held on February 12-14, 2015 in Nashville, TN with 234 individuals attending. Registration for this event increased by 38% this year, since only 170 faculty participated in the 2014 conference; one change in this year's programing that may have contributed to the increased attendance was the addition of poster abstracts. For the 8<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, the AACN-Johnson & Johnson Minority Faculty Scholars met for a preconference program just prior to the FDC on February 12, 2015. Looking ahead, the **Hot Issues Conference** will be held April 16-18, 2015 in Las Vegas, Nevada. At this year's event, participants will explore the latest thinking and strategies for promoting civility in the academic and practice environments. ## **Online Collaboration Community**

Established in October 2011, the online collaboration community (OCC) is offered exclusively for deans, faculty, graduate students, and special interest groups from member schools or affiliated organizations. The OCC provides an interactive, social media platform that enables members to share knowledge and best practices, establish collaborative relationships, and form strategic alliances with peers. Active communities include the Graduate Nursing Student Academy; Academic-Practice Partnerships; Clinical Nurse Leader (for practicing CNLs and CNL students); Global Alliance for Leadership in Nursing Education and Science; Public Health Nursing Education; Gerontology APRN Education; Practice Leadership Network; and the Jonas Scholars. To date, 11,324 deans, faculty, and student members are registered across all the various communities.

AACN *Faculty Link* newsletter is distributed monthly to over 30,000 deans and faculty at AACN member schools. ## **Faculty Awards**

The annual call for applications is currently open for AACN's four Faculty Teaching Awards; the deadline for applications is June 5, 2015.

- The Novice Faculty Excellence in Didactic Teaching Award
- The Novice Faculty Excellence in Clinical Teaching Award
- Excellence and Innovation in Teaching Award
- Advancement of Teaching and Learning Scholarship Award

The first two novice awards focus on faculty with five years or less teaching experience. *The Excellence and Innovation in Teaching Award* focuses on exemplary teaching practices, while the *Advancement of Teaching and Learning Scholarship Award* recognizes sustained and systematic inquiry into the practice of teaching and the environment and depth of student learning. #### **Outstanding Dissertation and DNP Final Project Awards**

AACN created this awards program to recognize and showcase outstanding PhD/DNS dissertations and DNP final projects completed by students in research- and practice-focused doctoral programs. The 2014 awardees (approved by the Board in October 2014) received their awards at the Doctoral Education Conference in January 2015.

At the Board's request, the application and review process for these awarded have been revised, including changes to the DNP award review process to more closely align with the *DNP Essentials* and the Implementation of the DNP Task Force recommendations. The revisions were approved by the Board in January 2015. The changes are reflected in the criteria for review and the new requirement of a preformatted abstract as part of the application, specific to each degree. The process for application review has also been revised.

The current call for nominations has been open since February 2015 and will close on September 16, 2015.
