

INTRODUCTION

- End-of-life (EOL) competencies are a crucial aspect of education for registered nurses
- One of the four spheres of the AACN Essentials
- Little literature exists regarding best methods to teach this

PURPOSE

To assess how the experience of an interactive conversation activity, the "Hello Game," influences nursing students' engagement in EOL conversations

THE HELLO GAME

- A non-threatening conversation game
- Helps others learn about what matters to you
- □ A small group card game with 30 questions that participants take time responding too

METHODS

- Qualitative descriptive design
- Researcher designed Likert scale and open-ended questions were sent to students 6 weeks following the conclusion of a dying and death nursing elective course
- □ All open-ended responses used were reviewed independently by two researchers using a descriptive, content analysis
- Descriptive statistics were used to analyze demographic questions and Likert style questions

End-of-Life Conversations: Teaching Undergraduate Nursing Students About Difficult Conversations Through Gamified Learning

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A two-hour gamified teaching strategy can facilitate EOL communication skills in nursing students



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It is imperative to meet the hospice/palliative care/supportive care sphere of care outlined in the **AACN Essentials**

RESULTS

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□ 69% of students (n=13) were 4th year students between the ages of 18-24

□ 92% have experienced the death of a loved one

□ 59% felt that the "Hello Game" was an effective teaching strategy for learning to engage in difficult conversations

□ 46% felt more comfortable working with others to make EOL decisions

QUALITATIVE FEEDBACK

"It definitely facilitated conversations" that I had not thought of having before."

Some of the questions I was able to take back to family members and discuss with them after."

LIMITATIONS

Convenience Sampling

Small sample size

CONCLUSIONS/IMPLICATIONS

Nurse educators need to engage their students in these difficult conversations to help them prepare for practice

Important for nurses to engage in social responsibility and have the ethical reasoning skills to engage persons in EOL conversations so their wishes may be respected
