Post Doctorate Experiences

Definition

 Postdoctoral scholar: engaged in mentored research and/or training with intent of acquiring skills needed to pursue career (Sherry et al., 2013)

Traditional design

- Components: Educational training, research training & career planning
- Resources: Stipend, protected time, funding
- Expectation: Freedom to conduct research, disseminate findings
- Ease transition from graduate school
- Launch independent research career




The VA Quality Scholars Program trains leaders in quality and patient safety for the VA and health care nationally and internationally

Interprofessional emphasis with physicians, doctoral-trained nurses, clinical psychologists and pharmacists as fellows and senior scholars



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
The Next Generation



Outcomes

- 44 nurses have completed the program
 - 24 PhDs,
 - 16 DNPs,
 - 4 pre-doctoral
- 19 nurses are enrolled currently
 - 4 PhD,
 - 6 DNP,
 - 9 pre-doctoral

Impact

- Fellows and alumni have significantly contributed to the strategic priorities of local and national VA through:
 - Collaboration with VAQS alumni, VA staff, affiliate trainees and faculty, and VA program offices
 - Involvement as educators during fellowship resulting in curriculum development and course redesign
 - Attainment of diverse roles as researchers, health system leaders, educators, and national experts

Placement after Fellowship

- 21% employed with federal government
 - Clinical Care (VA)
 - Leadership (VA & PHS)
 - Research (NIH)
- 27% contribute to QI leadership in healthcare settings outside of VA
- 60% with academic appointments
