

MAXIMIZING ACADEMIC CLINICAL PARTNERSHIPS: KEY STRATEGIES

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Overview

- Academic clinical partnerships provide opportunities for advancing clinical care practices, expanding faculty scholarship initiatives, and promoting student learning opportunities.
- Vanderbilt University School of Nursing (VUSN) has had an established academic clinical partnership with Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC) since 1984.

Overview

- This relationship has enabled VUSN and VUMC's Nursing Services to provide opportunities for nursing faculty and students to interact in an interprofessional environment with nurses, physicians, and medical students in the areas of teaching, research, clinical practice, and community service.
- In addition to VUMC, VUSN has several wellestablished academic clinical community partnerships.



Structure

- Multiple clinical leadership positions exist within VUMC and VUSN which link nursing faculty to clinical practice leadership.
 - VUSN's Dean has a role on the Medical Center Medical Board and the Vanderbilt Medical Group Executive Committee
 - The Executive Chief Nursing Officer for VUMC is also a Senior Associate Dean for Nursing Practice at VUSN
 - The Senior Associate Dean for Clinical and Community Partnerships is also responsible for the Nurse Faculty Practice Division of VUMC
 - The majority of the Advanced Practice Leaders are VUSN faculty



Structure

Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC) nurse leaders:

- Hold VUSN faculty positions
- Serve as clinical preceptors, DNP project facilitators, and on DNP and PhD student committees
- Are VUSN alumni from MSN, DNP and PhD programs
- Vanderbilt University School of Nursing (VUSN) faculty:
 - Serve in senior leadership roles
 - Serve on VUMC committees
 - Lead clinical research and quality improvement work



Structure

- Faculty have clinical practice sites throughout the healthcare system and practice as nurse practitioners, certified nurse-midwives, nurse informaticists, and nurse executives.
- Clinical practice nurses serve as preceptors for graduate students.
- There is practice integration & collaboration between VUSN faculty and clinical practice nurses throughout the academic health system.

Managing more than 2.5 million patient visits each year, Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC) is one of the largest academic medical centers in the Southeast, and is the primary resource for specialty and primary care in hundreds of adult and pediatric specialties for patients throughout Tennessee and the Mid-South.

- In FY19, VUMC had 66,000 inpatient discharges and performed more than 67,000 surgical operations (inpatient and outpatient), making it the largest health care facility in Middle Tennessee.
- VUMC is also the largest employer of non-governmental employees in central Tennessee, with more than 24,000 employees.



VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER

Vanderbilt University Adult Hospital and the Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt are recognized each year by U.S. News & World Report's Best Hospitals rankings as national leaders, with 15 nationally ranked adult and pediatric specialties.

Through the Vanderbilt Health Affiliated Network, VUMC is working with nearly 70 hospitals and 6,500 clinicians across Tennessee and five neighboring states to share best practices and bring value-driven and costeffective health care to the Mid-South.

Overview

- VUSN has been engaged in organized faculty practice >20 years
- VUSN faculty members practice in a variety of locations within VUMC and clinic locations in Nashville and the surrounding area
- Practice sites include:
 - Family health clinics
 - Employer-based clinics
 - Occupational health
 - Specialty-care clinics
 - Women's health
 - Neonatal intensive care

- Pediatric and adult primary care
- Pediatric and adult acute care
- Integrative health



VUMC/VUSN Partnership with Metro Nashville Public Schools

- 41st largest district 88,000 students
- Teacher's health Plan (9,200 active & retired teachers)
- Support staff covered by Metro Nashville Government (4,000 active employees)
- Partnership started in 2009 5 worksite clinics within 15 minutes' drive
- Over 30,000 visits per year

Interprofessional team including integrated behavioral health (Psych NP), Physical Therapy, On-site Pharmacy and Chiropractic Services

Full fitness center

Construction and operational costs fully funded by documented savings from the health plan

Recent Rand Independent Analysis

- Analysis of 2007-2015 period for teachers meeting inclusion criteria
- Employer health clinic as primary care home versus usual community care
- Lower inpatient admissions (31 vs. 53 per 1,000 teacher years)
- Lower annual healthcare cost (\$4,298 vs. \$5,043 in 2016 US dollars)
- Lower annual absent work hours (61 vs. 63)

Unique Integration Model

- VU Employed Faculty at VUMC
 - Faculty practice at VUMC through an Employee Services Agreement
 - Examples Genetics, Cancer Center (Pain and Symptom Management), Behavioral Health, Transplant
- Senior Associate Dean for Clinical and Community Partnership subcontracted to VUMC to run the Faculty Practice Division
- Faculty Leaders of Midwifery Practice and Mercury Courts
- VUMC APRNs Employed as Faculty at VUSN
 - Examples: small group leaders (clinical and professional courses), DNP committee members



Other Community Programs – VUSN Based

- Maternal Infant Health Outreach community health workers
- Students for Health Equity formalized program to place VU students in community projects targeting vulnerable populations

NURSE FACULTY MIDWIFERY PRACTICE

Full Scope Nurse-Midwifery Practice

- Almost 25 years in place
- Around 700 births at VUMC
- CNMs are attending providers
- Close partnership with Department of OB
- Co-management clinic for high risk
- Co-located with primary care and School of Medicine (Shade Tree Clinic)
- Integrated behavioral health



CHOOL OF NURSING

ACNM Triple Aim Award – Year After Year

Requirements to win the Triple Aim are:

- Primary cesarean birth rate 12.7% (target <23.9%)</p>
- Preterm birth rate 5% (target <11.4%)</p>
- Exclusive breastfeeding at 48 hrs postpartum rate 100% (target >81%)
- "Best Practice Award" for breastfeeding program
