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Research Method & Study Design

- Method: Qualitative
- Transcendental Phenomenological Moustaka's Model



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Research Questions

Q1 What are the lived experiences of Hispanic/Latino EAL nursing students in the academic setting?

Q2 What do Hispanic/Latino EAL nursing students perceive as strengths and challenges?

Q3 How do culture and multilingualism impact Hispanic/Latino EAL nursing students' experiences in nursing school?

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Recruitment and Sample

Sampling

- Purposeful
- Inclusion criteria
 - Currently enrolled in a BSN program for at least 1 semester OR
 - New graduate nurse (less than 1 year working as an RN)
 - Self Identify as Hispanic/Latino
 - Speak EAL
 - Must be willing to participate in a recorded interview

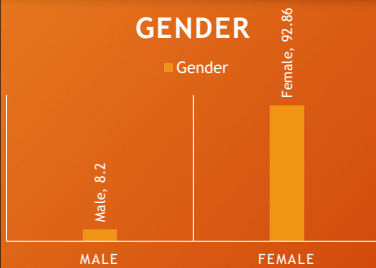
Recruitment

- Snowball sampling

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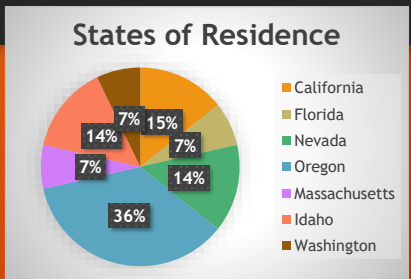
Sample Description

GENDER

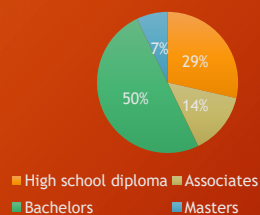


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Male=1
Female =13

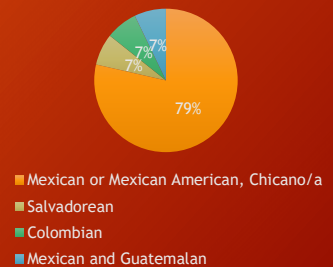
States of Residence

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Procedure for data collection

- Instrument: Researcher
- Semi-structured interviews using Zoom lasting 45 minutes on average
- Audio/video recorded
- Demographic information
- Transcription

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Implications for Nursing Education

- Lack of diversity in nursing programs perpetuates inequities and health disparities



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Implications for Nursing Practice

- Improved patient care
- Improved communication
- Broadened perspectives



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Recommendations for Nursing Education

- Implement Holistic Admissions
- Provide medical terminology and translations courses for multilingual students
- Ensure medical terminology, writing and academic language support
- Increase faculty of color
- Ensure Hispanic/Latino Students have support groups
- Provide financial support through scholarships and grants



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Limitations

- Sample was limited to BSN Students
- Many participants had another degree
- Excluded students who were unsuccessful in their programs
- Most participants identified as Mexican or Mexican American
- Only one participant identified as male

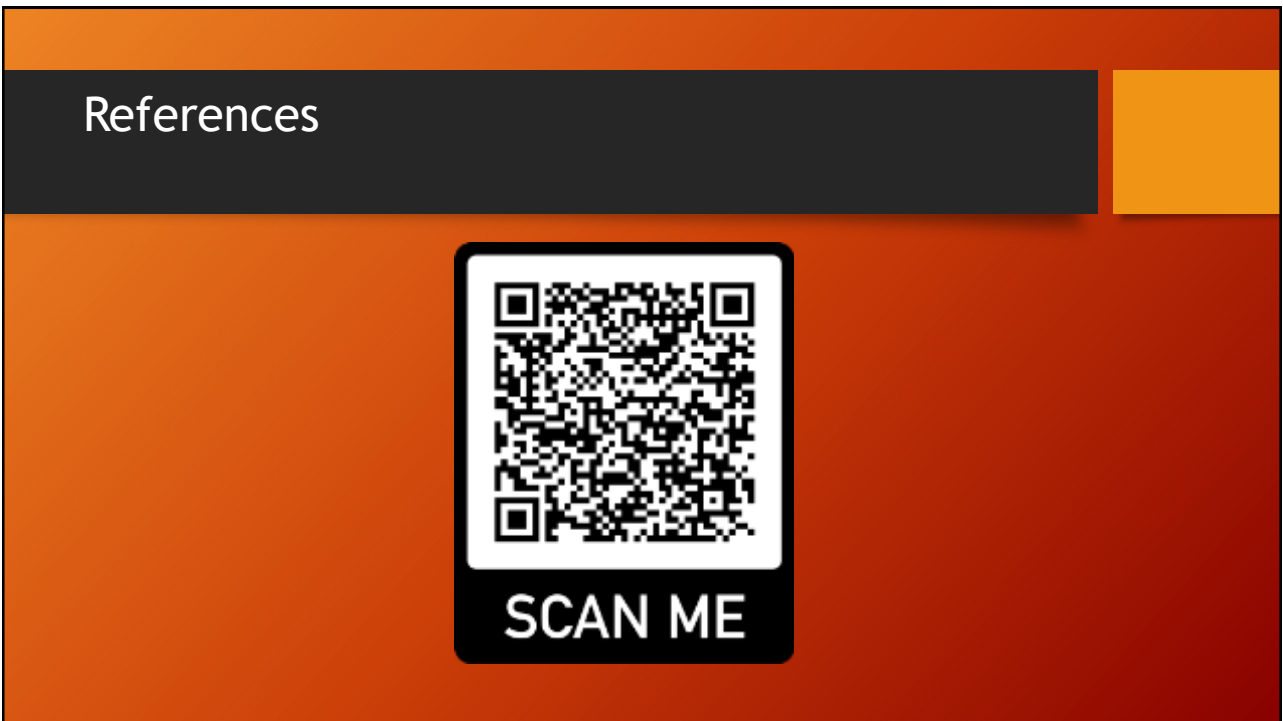
