Nursing students are not adequately prepared to provide safe high-quality care to **LGBTQ+** patients


OBJECTIVES


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

Biography

Dr. Bowen began her nursing career as an Army Nurse and served in the first Gulf War, Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm where she earned several awards including medals for Meritorious Service, the Liberation of Kuwait, and the Southwest Asia Ribbon with three oakleaf clusters. She is a nationally certified pediatric nurse practitioner and educator. Presently Dr. Bowen is the inaugural Associate Dean for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion at the University of Alabama School of Nursing.

Dr. Bowen is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing and serves on the Child, Adolescent and Family Expert Panel. Her expertise in pediatric health care and health disparities has been recognized at the municipal, state and national level. Dr. Bowen was featured in several episodes of the National Academy of Medicine Future of Nursing 2020-2030 podcast. She serves on the National Advisory Committees for the NIH Environmental Health Institute's and the CDC SelfMade Health Network.
