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Perceptions of Death/Palliative Care

- “I hope death is like being carried to your bedroom when you were a child & fell asleep on the couch during a family party and you can hear the laughter in the room next door.”

ELNEC Overview & Core Beliefs

- **ELNEC Overview:**

- 114 countries, 12 organizations involved in ELNEC
- Needs assessment in 2000 showed only 2% of textbooks discussed palliative/end-of-life care (RWJ)
- Core Question: *What is it like to care for those who are not going to get better?*

- **ELNEC Core Beliefs:**

- Family as the unit of care
- Nurses as advocates for patients
- Importance of culture, ethics, and spirituality in care
- Social justice and inclusive care
- Palliative care across all settings
- Interdisciplinary care is essential

Student's Perspective

- Need more education
- “Few” opportunities in clinical settings
- Anxiety and fears of death
- Faculty barriers
- Feel unprepared to provide palliative care
 - Role confusion with Interprofessional team
 - Integrating in didactic and clinical courses

Exemplars of Palliative Care Education

- Simulation
- Unfolding case study
 - Sophomore- Home visit in first semester meets patient
 - Junior level- symptom management, disease progression
 - Senior level- patient dies and post-mortal care

ELNEC Essentials & Personal Goals

- **ELNEC Essentials:**

- **Spheres of Care:** Palliative care as one of four spheres
- **Competencies:** Knowledge and skills needed for palliative care
- **Concepts:** Core concepts for teaching and practice

- **Personal Goals:**

1. Create realistic simulations for bereavement and end-of-life care course.
2. Educate faculty to teach this course across different sites.
3. Integrate interprofessional education with social work and COM students.

Teaching Strategies

- **Teaching Strategies:**

- Enhance ELNEC modules with active learning and student-centered approaches
- Incorporate asynchronous/online formats
- Collaborate with non-traditional settings and diverse environments

- **Competency-Based Education (CBE):**

- Focus on developing knowledge, skills, attitudes (KSA)
- Formative assessments for ongoing feedback
- Emphasizing practice readiness through clear pathways and outcomes

KSA's

- Knowledge
- Skills
- Abilities
- Attitude

Domains of Learning

- Cognitive (Knowledge)
- Psychomotor (Skills)
- Aesthetic/Affective (Abilities/Attitudes)

Tools for CBE

- Transparency
- Cover the material
- Clear Pathways
- Backwards Design

Outcomes

- What must the learner be able to determine by the end of the program, course, and class
- How will the learner be changed or different?
- What is the learner going to get at the end of this course?
- What are the behaviors the learner must demonstrated?
 - Program outcomes → course descriptions → course objectives → module objectives

Assessment

- How do you know that the learners have met the outcomes?
- How do you know the learner has changed?
- Principles for competency-based education and assessment
 - Frequent formative feedback- if you can't give feedback then it's not worth it
- Types:
 - Tests, quizzes, case studies, simulations, papers, presentations, projects, portfolios, skill checkoffs, listening sessions, observation of care

Bloom's

- **Remembering**- fill in the blank, matching, labeling, MC ?'s
- **Understanding**- papers, exams, case studies, class discussions, or concept maps
- **Applying**- simulation, case studies, and clinical stories
- **Analyzing**- case studies, critiques, labs, papers, projects, debates, or concept maps
(what does it look like to compare/contrast)
- **Evaluating**- journals, diaries, critiques, case reviews
- **Creating**- research projects, simulation, essays, teaching materials

Fostering psychological safety & trust

- Make connection- grounding exercises and mindful reflections
- Language is healing- create space for processing
- Awareness-
 - Trauma-informed care
 - Creating a safe environment
 - Supporting and teaching emotional regulation
 - Building relationships
