

Operational Core


Institutional Conditions

The Operational Core connects people and purpose through structure. It ensures that a nursing program's mission is not only articulated but also reflected in its day-to-day operations.

Five key **Institutional Conditions** define how operational excellence is achieved and sustained:

- **Infrastructure and Capacity**
- **Climate and Intergroup Relations**
- **Education and Scholarship**
- **Access and Success**
- **Community Engagement**

When these five conditions align, they create an environment where students, staff, and faculty, are supported, connected, and prepared to contribute meaningfully.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Academic excellence extends beyond campus. Engagement with clinical partners, local organizations, and communities reinforces social responsibility and aligns education with real-world health needs.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND CAPACITY

Strong infrastructure provides the physical, technological, financial, and human resources that enable high-quality learning and innovation. (AACN, 2021) It supports resilience, adaptability, and progress—especially when integrated with modern tools such as simulation, telehealth, and data-driven systems.

ACCESS AND SUCCESS

This condition ensures that opportunity and support reach everyone—students, staff, and faculty alike. It includes transparent recruitment, mentoring, professional growth, and systems that help individuals thrive and progress.

CLIMATE AND INTERGROUP RELATIONS

A healthy climate fosters collaboration, respect, and trust across roles and disciplines. Effective communication, fair interactions, and constructive dialogue create a sense of belonging and shared responsibility.

Education and scholarship reflect the intellectual core of academic nursing. Through relevant curricula, research, and innovation, programs prepare future nurses to lead, teach, and advance the profession.
