Dear Leader Schumer and Leader McConnell:

As the Senate continues to consider advancing the Build Back Better Act, the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN), the national voice of academic nursing that represents nearly 840 member schools, more than 580,000 nursing students, and more than 52,000 nursing faculty, urges you to preserve and pass the following essential provisions:

- **\$500 million for Schools of Nursing in Underserved Areas**: Similar to the Future Advancement of Academic Nursing (FAAN) Act (S.246), this investment would provide crucial resources to enroll and retain nursing students, recruit and retain diverse nursing faculty, expand clinical education opportunities, and modernize nursing education programs.
- **\$500 million for the Nurse Corps**: To support scholarships and loan repayment assistance for nurses at a healthcare facility with a critical shortage or nurse faculty at an accredited school of nursing.
- \$170 million to Grow and Diversify the Nursing Workforce in Maternal and Perinatal Health.

AACN member schools, faculty, and students continue to stand on the frontlines of this public health emergency, and we recognize that additional work must be done. We strongly urge the Senate to preserve these essential academic nursing provisions in any final bill. We stand ready to offer our resources as you work on these vital issues.
