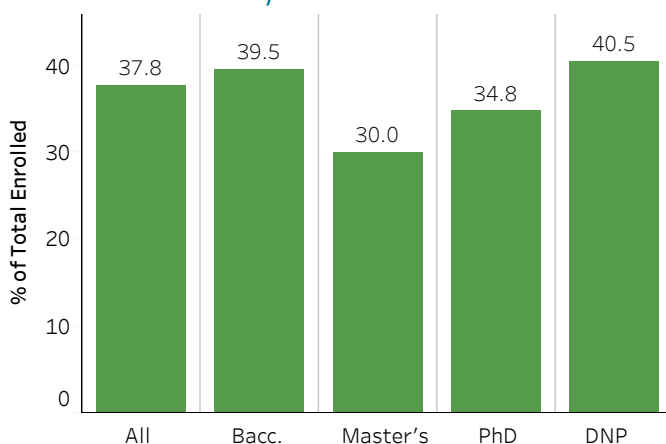

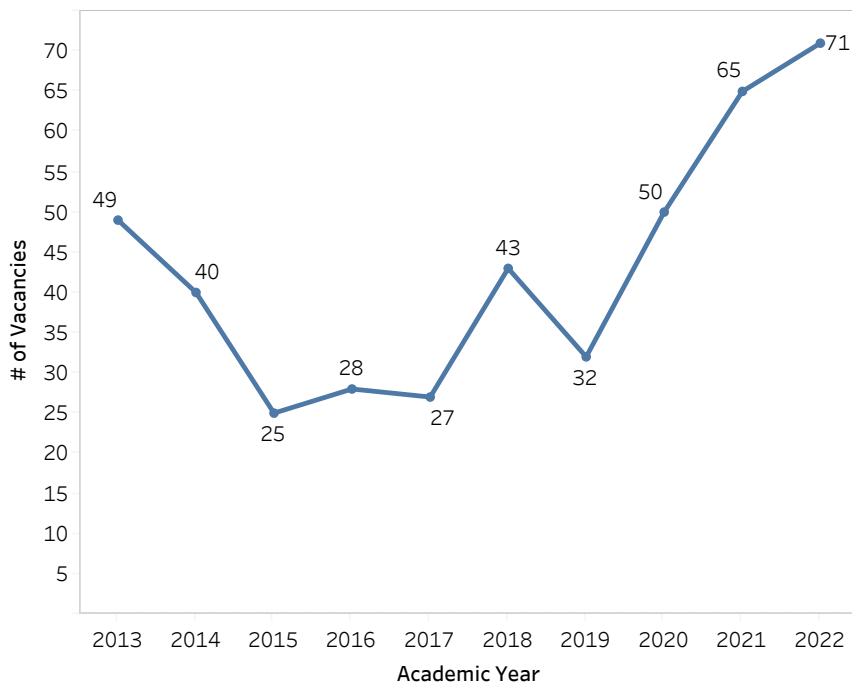
## STUDENT RACIAL/ETHNIC DIVERSITY %<sup>3</sup>

Budget constraints, an aging faculty, and increasing job competition from clinical sites are a few examples that contribute to this crisis.
