1. Cynthia Clark, PhD, RN, ANEF, FAAN

Professor Emeritus, School of Nursing, Boise State University, Boise, ID, and Education Consultant, Ascend Learning/ATI Nursing Education, Leawood, KS

Dr. Cynthia Clark is an award-winning Professor Emeritus with more than 30 years of experience in nursing education and practice, a nurse consultant for ATI Nursing Education, and the Founder of *Civility Matters*®. Her ground-breaking work on fostering civility has brought national and international attention to the controversial issues of incivility in academic and work environments. Her theory-driven interventions, empirical measurements, theoretical models, and reflective assessments provide “best practices” to prevent, measure, and address uncivil behavior and to create healthy workplaces. Dr. Clark served as a co-chair for the American Nurses Association Professional Panel for Incivility, Bullying, and Workplace Violence and serves as a fellow in the American Academy of Nursing and the National League for Nursing Academy of Nursing Education. She is the recipient of numerous teaching, research, and service awards including the 2011 NLN Excellence in Educational Research Award and the 2013 Journal of Nursing Education (JNE) Christine A. Tanner Scholarly Writing Award.

2. Sheila Davis, DNP, ANP-BC, FAAN

Chief Nursing Officer, Partners In Health, Boston, MA

Dr. Sheila Davis is the Chief Nursing Officer at Partners in Health (PIH) where she also led the organization’s Ebola response efforts in West Africa during the 2014 epidemic. She has been a nursing leader in the field of HIV/AIDS since the mid-1980s and served on the National Board of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care (ANAC). She entered the global health arena in 1999 responding to the global HIV pandemic working in several countries. She was the co-founder of a small NGO that worked in South Africa and Boston from 2004-2010 on health projects, including a rural village nurse clinic. Dr. Davis is a frequent national speaker on global health and clinical topics, including HIV/AIDS, the Ebola epidemic, leadership in public health, and the role of nursing in human rights. She was inducted as Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing in 2008 and in 2009 was inducted as a member of the inaugural class of 12 Carl Wilken’s Fellows working on anti- genocide global efforts as part of the Genocide Intervention Network. She recently completed a Robert Wood Johnson Executive Nurse Fellowship as part of the 2012-2015 cohort.

3. Larry J. Goodman, MD, CEO

Former Chief Executive Officer of Rush University Medical Center, President of Rush University, President of the Rush System for Health, and Principal Officer of the Rush Board of Trustees, Chicago, IL

Dr. Larry J. Goodman is the Former Chief Executive Officer at Rush University Medical Center, February 2002 to May 2019, and served a dual role as President of Rush University until February 2019. Prior to being named President and CEO, Dr. Goodman served as Senior Vice President for Medical Affairs, Dean of Rush Medical College and Medical Director of Cook County Hospital. He is a

Professor of Medicine. His research has focused on infectious diseases, particularly gastrointestinal infections in HIV-positive patients. He is also known for promoting innovation in medical education and has written extensively about medical school curricula and how students select a specialty for residency training. He played a critical role in crafting the academic affiliation agreement between Rush and Cook County Hospital.

4. Lt. General Dorothy A. Hogg

Surgeon General, Headquarters US Air Force, Arlington, VA

Lt. General Dorothy A. Hogg is the Surgeon General, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Arlington, VA and functional manager of the U.S. Medical Service of the U.S. Air Force. She advises the Secretary of the Air Force and the Air Force Chief of Staff and the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs. She directs a \$6.1 billion, 44,000-person integrated healthcare delivery and readiness system serving 2.6 million beneficiaries at 76 military treatment facilities worldwide. She is the first woman and first nurse to hold this position. Prior to this role, she was the Deputy Surgeon General and Chief of the Air Force Nurse Corps. Lt. General Dorothy Hogg entered the Air Force in 1984, has commanded at the squadron and group level, and served as the deputy command surgeon for two major commands. She was deployed in support of operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom. She has received many distinguished awards and decorations which include Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal.

5. Terry Fulmer, PhD, RN, FAAN

President, The John A. Hartford Foundation, New York, NY

Dr. Terry Fulmer, serves as the President of The John, A. Hartford Foundation, and is known for conceptualization and development of the national NICHE program and research on the topic of elder abuse and neglect, funded by National Institute on Aging and the National Institute of Nursing Research. Dr. Fulmer is an elected member of the National Academy of Medicine, Trustee for the Josiah Macy Jr. Foundation, and is co-chair of the National Academy of Medicine's Forum on Aging, Disability, and Independence. She has served as Dean of Health Sciences at Northeastern University, Dean of the New York University College of Nursing, Chair of the National Advisory Committee for the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Executive Nurse Fellows Program and has held a board position at the Institute for Healthcare Improvement, the Geriatrics and Gerontology Advisory Committee, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. She is a Distinguished Practitioner of the National Academies of Practice and currently an attending nurse and senior nurse in the Yvonne L. Munn Center for Nursing Research at the Massachusetts General Hospital and an attending nurse at Mount Sinai Medical Center in NYC. She was the first nurse to serve on the board of the American Geriatrics Society and was the first nurse to serve as President of the Gerontological Society of America.
