Dear Representatives Tonko and Luján,

On behalf of the 40 undersigned organizations representing the Nursing Community Coalition, we would like to thank you for introducing the Addiction Treatment Access Improvement Act of 2017 (H.R. 3692). The members of the Nursing Community Coalition are the cross section of education, practice, research, and regulation within the nursing profession and fully support the goal of this legislation to curb the opioid epidemic. With over four million licensed Registered Nurses (RNs), Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs), and nursing students, the profession embodies the drive and passion to continually improve care for patients, families and communities. The coalition is committed to improving the health of our nation and we believe H.R. 3692 helps to achieve this end.

Broadening the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 823 (g)(2)(G)) to include APRNs will greatly expand access to patients suffering from opioid addictions. Opioid use and dependence are growing public health threats, despite the many actions put in place to try to curb this crisis. APRNs are critical agents in treating patients that experience these crises, and are sometimes the sole providers of this care in regions that struggle to recruit and retain providers. The Addiction Treatment Access Improvement Act of 2017 would create a permanent solution so that nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, certified registered nurse anesthetists, and certified nurse-midwives are able to use their clinical training to help combat this national crisis.

Again, we commend the introduction of H.R. 3692, and appreciate your support for America's practice by reducing barriers that impede access to quality care.
