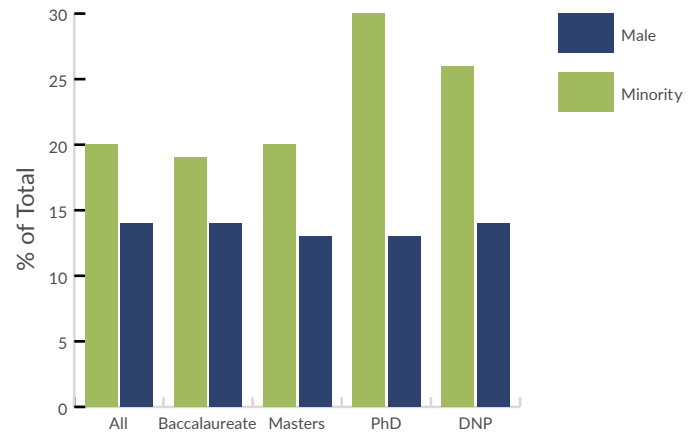

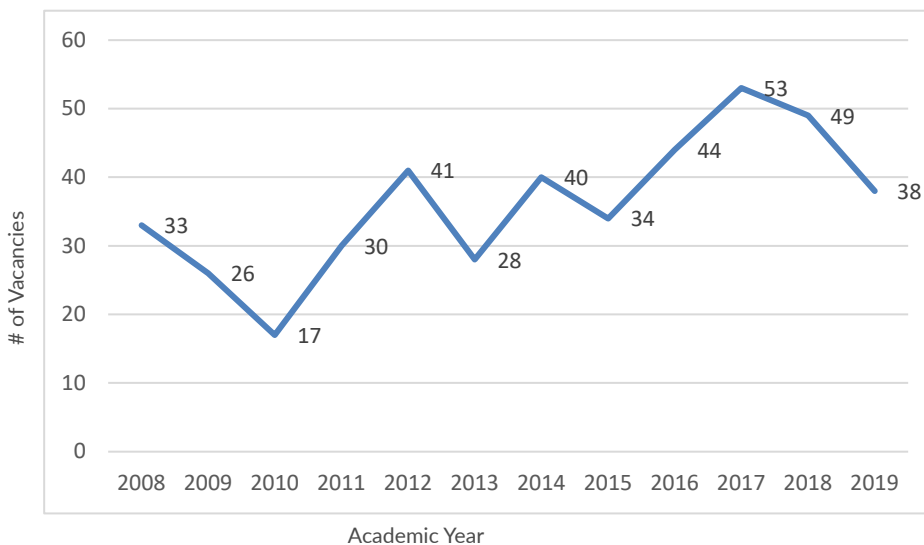
STUDENT DIVERSITY % BY PROGRAM

Budget constraints, an aging faculty, and increasing job competition from clinical sites all contribute to this crisis.
