CONFERENCES

Nearly 4,000 nurse educators attend AACN's conferences each year making these offerings the preferred professional development option for baccalaureate and graduate nursing program faculty.

TRANSFORM CONFERENCE: WHERE NURSE FACULTY AND INNOVATION MEET

Focused on faculty teaching in baccalaureate and master's programs, the annual Transform Conference highlights new developments in academic nursing along with the latest innovations impacting higher education and health care. Sessions feature thought leaders who are redefining how professional nurses are educated and how they practice. Faculty enjoy robust discussions and network-building with those on the leading edge of nursing education.

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE

The Faculty Development Conference takes place as a pre-event to Transform Conference and is an informative and engaging program that supports those new to the faculty role but also seeks to provide educational opportunities for more experienced educators. Experts and seasoned academic leaders share their insights and key principles for innovative and engaging course design while also addressing aspects of the faculty role related to creating an active learning environment, clinical teaching, and student evaluation.

DOCTORAL EDUCATION CONFERENCE

The Doctoral Education Conference is focused on those who teach in doctoral programs, as well as those with primary responsibility for developing doctorally-prepared nurses, advanced practice registered nurses, and advancing research agendas. The Doctoral Conference convenes annually to address national trends in doctoral education, strategies to increase enrollment, and methods to maintain quality in doctoral education. Conference hallmarks include content addressing both the practice and the research doctorate, where attendees are encouraged to consider and debate issues central to doctoral nursing education.

ACCESS, CONNECTION, ENGAGEMENT (ACE) SYMPOSIUM

Individuals with an interest and focus on advancing diversity and creating more inclusive learning environments should attend this symposium. Inclusive excellence embodies both quality and diversity. Sessions focus on preparing a more diverse nursing workforce to provide high-quality care, which is critical to addressing healthcare disparities and health inequities.

EXECUTIVE DEVELOPMENT SERIES (EDS) FOR FACULTY

The Executive Development Series for Faculty supports development of leadership principles and skill necessary for successful transition of faculty into leadership positions. The leadership topics and learning exercises offer insights into the opportunities, challenges and responsibilities of academic nursing leaders and administrators.

CLINICAL NURSE LEADER (CNL) SUMMIT

This national forum is offered for all healthcare and academic audiences currently implementing or interested in exploring CNL education and practice. Major health systems across the nation have discovered how CNLs transform practice and improve care. The summit showcases these achievements in education and practice and provides tools to enhance an understanding of the changing healthcare environment and the value added by CNLs.
