Doris Goodwin, a White House Fellow in the Lyndon B. Johnson administration, is a biographical author of past U.S. presidents. Not only a *New York Times* bestselling author, she also won the Pulitzer Prize for *No Ordinary Time: Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt: The Home Front During World War II*. An expert in the doctrine of leadership, Ms. Goodwin relies on the lessons of the past to shed light on cultural, economic, and political transformations that define today's turbulent times.

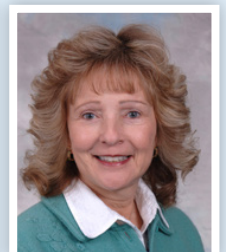
