

## PROMOTE RECOGNITION OF YOUR CNL CREDENTIAL

- Display your framed CNL certificate and wear the CNL lapel pin.
- List your CNL credential on business cards, stationery, etc.
- Announce earning your certification and recertification in local and national publications. See sample press release at <u>www.aacnnursing.org/CNL-Certification/CNL-Day</u>.
- Give a presentation promoting CNL certification and the CNL skill set.
- Write an article for publication on the benefits of the CNL and certification.
- Document the benefits of CNL certification for your next job performance evaluation.
- Include the CNL credential in your portfolio.
- Include certification status in your curriculum vitae or resume.
- Include the credential whenever your name is professionally listed.
