> IPACC Study

 5-component intervention included interprofessional education of ICU clinicians

- > ICCS Study
 - CodeTalk: Interactive educational intervention
 - Communication skills for palliative care
 - Interprofessional facilitators
 - Nurse practitioner students and internal medical residents
- > Facilitator Study
 - Use of interprofessional role play in training





Interprofessional Education

- > Foundations for Interprofessional Practice
 - Collaborative group of educators
 - > Karen McDonough MD, Jen Danielson PharmD, Amy Kim DDS, Sarah Shannon PhD RN and others
 - 600 students
 - > nursing, medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, PA, and dietetics students divided into \cong 35 small groups
 - 70+ interprofessional faculty in teaching teams
 - Interprofessional topics:
 - > Team error disclosure
 - > Care of Veterans
 - > "Doris": Different views of health
 - > Pediatric oral health



Interprofessional Education

- > Palliative care clinical training
 - Generalist training in all clinician training
 - Specialty training for ARNPs and medical residents/fellows
 - > Year of clinical and didactic training
 - > Acute and ambulatory palliative care clinical experience

Two meanings

Barriers to Interprofessional R/E/P in Nursing

- 1. Logistics, scheduling, costs, resources, etc.
- 2. Broken tenure system
- 3. Fragmented link to practice
- 4. Self (profession) defeating academic role
 - expectations
 - Research/scholarship
 Teaching
 - reaching
 Service/citizenship
 - Practice/clinical



Improving Interprofessional Research, Education and Practice in Nursing
