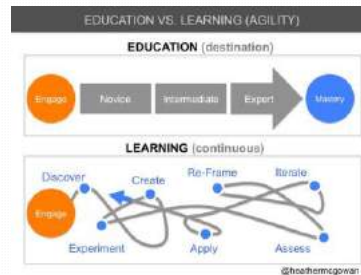
## Objectives

- Utilize strategies such as surveys & focus groups utilizing virtual platform.
- Monthly Open Forums targeted at rural nursing cohorts.
  - Investigate alternative funding options to support educational costs.
- International avenues for the delivery of accredited graduate programs for rural populations of nurses.

  - *Create an education model beyond survival.*
  - *Utilize our rural students as our educators.*
