BSN Veteran/Medic Option

Program Description Admission Curriculum

Designed primarily for military medics and corpsmen, this is the **only program option in the State of Ohio** funded to address the unique needs of the military medic and corpsmen by offering a variety of specilized services.


This BSN option takes into account military training in specific health specialties to provide college credit and/or reduce number of clinical hours. Starting in the fall semester, the accelerated option will also allow qualified applicants to complete nursing coursework in five consecutive semesters, and shorten completion time to 20 months.




Benefits and Impact
