# Office of Research & Engagement Carnegie Classification for Community Engagement


Community engagement describes collaboration between institutions of higher education and their larger communities for the mutually beneficial exchange of knowledge and resources in a context of partnership and reciprocity.





### **Academic Service-Learning**

Service-learning is a course-based experiential learning strategy that engages students in meaningful and relevant service with a community partner while employing ongoing reflection to draw connections between the service and course content.



#### **Benefits for Students**

Apply learning to "real world" non-nursing contexts

Ability to develop and achieve program outcome behaviors

- Communication
- Critical Reasoning
- Professionalism
- Leadership
- Safe Practice





### **Benefits for Faculty Mentors**

- Sharing of expertise and wisdom
- Satisfaction with observing student growth
- Recognition for serving as mentor
- Opportunity for scholarly activities



### **Benefits for Community Partner**

#### Consistent student resources

- Four semester commitment
- Decreased need for training

#### Service Learning project outcomes

 Mutual goal to improve a process or meet need of population served

### Planning for ASL Experience

- Surveying incoming students
   Areas of community interests
   Current volunteer experience
- Networking with colleagues
   Potential community partnerships
- Educating faculty mentors
- Developing Service Learning Partnership
   Initiate relationships through face to face meetings



#### Implementing ASL Experience

- Matching junior students with community partners
- Assigning Faculty Mentor/Faculty liaison
- Establishing contact with community partner
- Completing student-community Partner Memorandum of Collaboration (MOC)

## Evaluation



### **Evaluation of Program Outcomes**

- Reflections each semester
- Quality Improvement project
- Address 5 student behaviors
  - Communication
  - Critical Reasoning
  - Professionalism
  - Leadership
  - Safe Practice



## Reflection Assignments

Structured questions provided to students that address

- Achievement of student behaviors
- Understanding of course material
- Personal growth



## Student ASL Projects

 Collaboratively developed between the student and the Community Partner

 Students identify the population (P); an intervention (I); what will be compared (C); the outcomes (O); and the time frame (T) for addressing the identified problem

### **Examples of Projects**

- Protocol for triaging fans for the American Red Cross
- Educating parents about what is covered in an afterschool program
- Resurrect a community garden at a local school to assist students learn about healthy eating


- Poster presentation at University-wide Exhibition of Undergraduate Research and Creative Activities (EUReCA)

## Lessons Learned



#### Lessons learned

- Clear instructions and expectations for all parties
- Clear communication between Community Partners, students and faculty mentors
- Need for personnel resources
- Buy-in from stakeholders
