Interfaith America brought together a group from different health fields to discuss religious diversity.


Case studies developed which allowed integration of interfaith concepts in medical-surgical content.


Religiously diverse case studies were included in an advanced medical-surgical course in both a BSN and ABSN cohort as a pilot project.


Nursing faculty were introduced to interfaith case studies and encouraged to use throughout the curriculum.

Case Study Method

- Can be used in classroom, simulation, or as prep assignment
- Brings an element of active learning and real-world experience
- Allows students to practice assessment, analysis, decision-making, communication, and prioritization
- Fosters critical thinking, and clinical judgement
- Enlivens classroom discussion and develops collaboration
- Permits student to be the decision-maker
- Encourages reticent learner to feel a valued part of the community

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Building and Using a Case Study for Teaching Interfaith Concepts

- Include learning outcomes linked to course learning outcomes.
- Design case study to promote discussion; use what/how, not yes/no questions.
- Establish the context of the case, then introduce characters.
- Use examples from practice with non-identifiable clients and situations.
- Write case study without your personal analysis.
- Develop case study as generalizable, include theory and practice; write the case to allow modification for other courses.

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
