COVID-19 Policy

Masks, work correctly over your mouth and nose, are required in all public and patient-facing areas regardless of vaccination status. If visitors choose to attend a meeting or event in a non-patient care area, they may choose to remove their mask if they are fully vaccinated. If any attendees are not up-to-date with their COVID-19 vaccines, then removal of masks is permitted if ≥ 6 feet distance can be maintained between non-up-to-date attendees and all others. Attendees who have a confirmed exposure to COVID-19 and are in the quarantine period must maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from all others (masked or non-masked) while their own mask is removed. When the exposed attendee is masked, they must maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from non-masked attendees. Individuals who are immunocompromised are advised to continue to wear a mask. This policy is subject to change at any time. We will comply with current public health guidance as well as state and local regulations at the time of the meeting.
